
Cultural particularities

Long history of distilling strong alcohol at home

Slivovice – Plumb brandy with alcohol range 50 – 70%

Currently not legal, but in some regions every fifth household has illegal distilling equipment









Cultural particularities

40 years of communist regime 1948-1989

- full employment
- not enough possibilities for personal growth and independence
- -excessive free time
- -closed borders
- -cheap alcohol
- -drug problems officially don't exist



Current situation

Cheap alcohol – in bars and restaurants, it is not uncommon to find beer cheaper than soft drinks

Bottle of beer 1.20\$


Glass of wine 1.50\$


Whisky (shot glass) 2.00\$

Current situation

Legal drinking age (18) is not efficiently enforced by law






It is easy or very easy to buy alcohol. (survey of 16-yearold students) 35% of them drink at least once a week



- Regions with high unemployment
- Open borders free flow of drugs
- Extreme pressures to be successful
- Carving for new experience (not available before 1990)



The average amount of alcohol consumed when drinking (survey among 16-year-old students)

Statistics

Alcohol consumption - pure 100% alcohol per adult in liters

- 1 <u>Uganda</u> 19.47
- 2 <u>Luxembourg</u> 17.54
- 3 Czech Republic 16.21 (4.3 gallons)
- 7 France 13.54
- 43 <u>United States</u> 8.51 (2.3 gallons)

(WHO, 2004, counted for adults 15 and older)


Statistics

Alcohol

- -Addiction 5% of the population
- -Problems with alcohol 10% of the population

Illicit drugs

37 000 problem users (12 000 heroin, 20 000 Pervitin – methamphetamine, 5000 other drugs)





AA and NA 27 groups of AA, 10 of them in Prague 1 group of NA in Prague

Only about 5% of people with alcohol problems or addiction have experience with self-help support groups



Treatment and counseling

Out-patient treatment

-368 psychiatric offices

-19 non-governmental institutions

Pharmacotherapy, psychotherapy, socio-therapy – medical staff + social worker

In-patient treatment (3-6 months) Structured time and rules

-in psychiatric units of hospitals

- -50 adult units (1275 beds)
 - -4 child and youth units
- Medical treatment majority of the employees are medical professional
- Psychotherapy group therapy, community life of
- Work therapy actual work for the hospital
- Free time activities learn how to spend free time



Treatment and counseling

Detox units – 19 attached to central hospitals

- •Pharmacotherapy detoxification
- Psychotherapy motivation
- Psychotherapy referrals to treatment centers

Therapeutic communities (long term)

24 places with 223 beds

Aftercare agencies

- •Psychotherapy motivation, dealing with traumatic experience, learning new behavior and strategies for staying drug-free
- •Social Work practical problems: money, work, accommodation
