ORCID (Open Researcher & Contributor ID)

ORCID is a global registry of unique author identifiers based on a non-commercial platform. ORCID is supported by many publishers (Elsevier, Springer and others), grant agencies and database administrators (WoS, SCOPUS, ...). ORCID can be used not only for publishing, but also e.g. in grant applications and thus problems with misspelling of names or misattribution of outputs to individual authors can be avoided.

Within the ORCID profile, the different identifiers and affiliations used by the researcher can be unified to ensure that they are clearly organised. ORCID can be linked to other identifiers such as ResearcherID and Scopus Author Identifier to pass on publication information, so there is no need to fill in each profile individually.

The ORCID profile can also include other information, such as educational background, main research areas, grants and awards, etc. It is also important to be able to customize the privacy level for each area (Works, Affiliations, Fundig, etc.).

Main advantages:

- Possibility to link multiple profiles (Researcher ID, Scopus Author Identifier,...)
- Automatic transfer of data from other profiles
- Option to set privacy for individual items
- Option to log in via institutional account (secondary password in IS) or social media
- Auto-update
- Multilingual version including Czech


